Marking Policy

1. Aim

To ensure that pupil's progress and attainment is regularly and accurately assessed and that feedback clearly helps them to improve.

2. Objectives

2.1 To ensure that pupils' progress is regularly assessed

2.2 To ensure that written feedback has a positive impact on learning and pupil progress

2.3 To ensure that written feedback recognises hard work and effort

3. Expectations

3.1 Teachers are expected to:

3.1.1 Ensure that pupils receive written feedback at least once every six lessons (Light touch marking should be used at other times)

3.1.2 Ensure that written feedback contains commands and instructions on how to improve. Commands may be phrased as a question or prompt, to stimulate each pupil and initiate a response

3.1.3 Ensure that written feedback relates specifically to the learning objective

3.1.4 Avoid statements such as 'good work' as these do not actively facilitate progression

3.1.5 Provide DIRT (Dedicated Improvement and Reflection Time) to allow pupils the opportunity to respond to their teacher's comments and subsequently correct and improve their work

3.1.6 Provide pupils with mark schemes and success criteria in order for them to mark and level their own, and their peers' work accurately

3.1.7 Provide praise to pupils who make considerable effort or progress with the learning objective

3.1.8 Refrain from using excessive praise as this can lead to confusion over what 'doing well' actually means

3.1.9 Highlight a maximum of five literacy errors for any one pupil

3.1.10 Use the whole school literacy codes to draw attention to aspects of literacy

3.2 Marking and the implementation of this policy is the responsibility of all teachers.

3.3 Pupils are expected to:

3.3.1 Self-assess and correct any errors identified by their teacher in green pen

3.3.2 Respond to their teacher's commands and instructions in green pen

3.3.3 Peer assess in purple pen

3.3.4 Ensure that the Whole School Literacy Code is present on the front of all their exercise books (MFL will use their own literacy code applicable to them)

3.4 Subject Leaders are expected to:

3.4.1 Ensure that their curriculum area marking policy enables the Whole school Marking Policy to be effectively implemented

3.4.2 Ensure that the impact of the curriculum area marking policy is monitored by routine scrutiny of pupils' work

3.5 The Leadership Team are expected to:

3.5.1 Monitor the implementation of the Whole School Marking Policy

3.5.2 Regularly scrutinise pupils' work, at least three times each year, to assess the quality and positive impact of written feedback on pupil progress
