Frequently Asked Questions

How is school keeping my child safe?

We are following Public Health England advice and increasing our cleaning routines.

What do I do if my child is ill?

If you believe your child has symptoms of Covid-19, you should keep them at home and use the NHS online service.

What do I do if my child is told to self-isolate?

Please contact school so that we are aware.

What do I do if my child has an underlying medical condition and this may make them more vulnerable to the symptoms of the virus?

Contact your GP or NHS 111 for specific guidance and keep us informed of any important advice that has been received from medical professionals.

What if the school has to close?

We will communicate with you about what your child needs to do. We are developing a range of strategies should the school be forced to close for a period of time. We have plans for a deep clean should this be required.

What will happen if exams or practical exam / assignment work is disrupted?

Exam boards are working on contingency plans should this happen. Exam boards and educational settings will consider any unavoidable disruption.
