## **Home School Partnership Policy**

We are a Catholic community where every person is valued. We recognise each pupil as made in the image of God, all with different gifts and qualities. Christ is at the heart of our school and we promote a community where all pupils can be safe, be themselves, be proud of who they are, be happy and make our community a better place. This policy reflects our mission to Love God, Work Hard and Be Kind.

## **Helping Your Child at Holy Cross**

It is our experience that the most happily adjusted and successful pupil is the one whose parent/guardian takes an active and supportive role in their education. To help your child to adjust and settle in to their new school we would ask that:

You carefully explain this **PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT** to your child.

Encourage him/her to put together a folder of their achievements to date (in and out of school). Make sure that they give this to their Form Tutor as this will be the basis of establishing relationships.

Become familiar with the **PUPIL DIARY** and its contents and go through it with your child. Use it yourself to keep in touch with the Form Tutor on any matters you wish to draw to his/her attention. Each teacher will use it to keep you informed. It can also be used to write notes explaining absence.

## **Parent Teacher Consultation**

We are committed to providing the best service to you. Parent Evenings are held annually, and each year you will receive three progress reports to inform you of your child's attainment and learning. We would ask you to attend Parent/Guardian meetings throughout the school life of your child. Guidance Evenings are also held at pertinent points.

If you wish to contact school please use the pupil diary to send in a written message or phone between 8.00 am and 4.15 pm (outside of these times a message can be left on the answer machine). It will not be possible for a teacher to leave their class to speak to a parent, so please make a prior appointment to see a teacher. School, however, will respond to your request as quickly as possible and certainly within 48 hours. The first point of contact for any pastoral matters is the Form Tutor.

## **Uniform**

Uniform is the outward sign that pupils are part of the Holy Cross family and shows they are proud to be part of our school community. We encourage you as parents to ensure that the wearing of uniform is strictly followed and that your child wears it with a sense of pride. If you have any uncertainties, please ask.

## **Timetable**

To begin with, your child will need some help in working out his/her timetable. The timetable will be written in the Diary, and explained carefully to your child by the Form Tutor. It is particularly helpful if you can help your child with which books, equipment and kit to bring each day.

## **Home Learning**

Our school has a policy of home learning “entitlement”, which can be a valuable learning tool. We ask you actively and consistently to ensure that home learning is completed. This is one of the most positive ways of assisting us in our work and ensuring that your child is getting the best out of his/her education. Home learning is meant to consolidate work carried out in school and is absolutely essential to ensure future examination success. As our partners, we also ask you to inform us should you feel your child is getting insufficient home learning, or the pattern of home learning is erratic or patchy, and immediate steps will be taken to rectify the situation.

## **Teams/Remote Learning**

If at some point, we have to send a year group or class home to isolate or if your child has to isolate due to COVID, we will provide work via Show my Homework and Microsoft Teams. Your child will be issued with an Office365 account on arrival with their own email address. ## **Satchel One System**

Homework at Holy Cross is set through the on-line system, ‘Satchel One’. This system allows you as a parent to track and check your child’s homework. ## **Bullying**

- monitor individual pupil's progress and produce a report that will inform parents of such progress on a termly basis
- arrange parental meetings to discuss the progress and educational needs of the individual pupil
- alert and consult parents when any difficulties arise either with their own child or on whole school issues
