The Eucharistic Prayer

At the time he was betrayed and entered willingly into his passion,

THE BLOOD OF THE NEW AND ETERNAL COVENANT,
WHICH WILL BE POURED OUT FOR YOU AND FOR MANY
FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS.
DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME.

P/ The mystery of faith:

R/ **When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup,
we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again.**

P/ Therefore, as we celebrate the memorial of his Death and Resurrection,
we offer you, Lord, the Bread of life and the Chalice of salvation,
giving thanks that you have held us worthy
to be in your presence and minister to you.

Humbly we pray that, partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ,
we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit.

Remember, Lord, your Church, spread throughout the world,
and bring her to the fulness of charity,
together with Leo, our Pope,
John, our Archbishop,
Tom, his Assistant Bishop,
and all the clergy.

Remember also our brothers and sisters
who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection,
and all who have died in your mercy:
welcome them into the light of your face.

Have mercy on us all, we pray,
that with the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God,
with blessed Joseph, here Spouse,
with the blessed Apostles
and all the Saints who have pleased you throughout the ages,
we may merit to be co-heirs to eternal life
and may praise and glorify you through you Son, Jesus Christ.

Through him,

and in him,
O God almighty Father,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
all glory and honour is yours,
for ever and ever.
