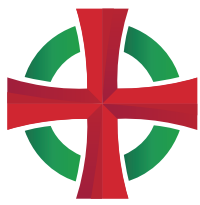

Year 10	Personal Development Sex Education Careers Relationships Mental Health Online Finance	<p>Dignity: Pupils consider how to develop their values and conscience. Pupils explore different attitudes to abortion and consider when does life begin. Pupils recognise the sign of an abusive relationship by considering examples and learn how to seek support if needed. Pupils learn how to apply healthy coping strategies to promote emotional well being. Pupils learn the damaging effects of online behaviour including revenge pornography. Pupils consider the impact of their digital footprint on their life in the future.</p> <p>The Common Good and Dignity: Pupils consider the consequences of knife crime for families and the community.</p> <p>Option for the Poor: Pupils consider the types of loans available and the impact it has on their financial future including the dangers of pay day loans.</p> <p>The Dignity of Work and Participation: Pupils work on their interview skills preparing them for the world of work. Pupils understand how to manage exam stress and seek support if needed.</p> <p>Dignity and The Common Good: Pupils consider the dangers of stereotyping including misogyny and how to challenge it.</p> <p>The Common Good: Pupils understand the impact extremism can have on individuals and communities.</p> <p>Option for the Poor: Pupils learn the importance of budgeting when renting or buying a property and how to manage household expenses.</p> <p>The Dignity of Work and Participation: Pupils work on revision skills and prepare their applications for college.
